Sunday School



The long “wait” is over – the skies have cleared, the flooding-rains have ended, the farmers are in the fields, ball games are being played – it’s official now; Summer has *finally* arrived. I would venture to say that “waiting” isn’t a strong characteristic in a lot of us. Let’s be honest – how many of us “enjoy” a nice long wait? Somebody estimated that most of us spend somewhere between 45-62 minutes *every* day waiting on something. Waiting for the light to turn green; waiting at the drive-thru; waiting for “the next available operator”; waiting for your computer to boot-up; waiting for the nurse to say “the doctor will see you now”.

Now that’s a lot of waiting! But the most important aspect is not the waiting; it’s what we do with all that time while we’re waiting. Most of us will try to find something to “do” – read a book, listen to the radio, watch the TV in the waiting room, work on our laptops. But do we ever think about using that time, that “waiting” period, to seek God ... to pray ... to just be still and listen for His voice ..

The psalmist writes in Psalm 27:14...” Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.” Sometimes we get impatient as we wait for Him to give us an answer. We may feel that we are wasting time as we wait, but we forget that God’s timing is *perfect*. He knows exactly what we need, and exactly when we need it – all we have to do is be patient and wait for Him. The Lord often uses those “waiting periods” in our lives to *refresh* us – to give us new strength, to renew our faith, and to teach us *HIS* ways. As we spend time “*waiting on God*”, it allows HIM time to develop qualities in us that simply can’t be developed any other way. There undoubtedly will be “waiting periods” throughout our busy summer schedules – let’s try and make good use of these times by allowing God to teach us, and to mold us into the people that He wishes for us to be.

God has provided for each of us the perfect “*Waiting Room*” where He teaches us about His perfect timing, and reveals to us a deeper understanding of just “Who He Is”. God’s perfect Waiting Room – *Sunday School*



North Knox Social Ministries

In January and February, 2009, we gave food to 314 families with a total amount of 726 people. We helped 18 families from the Trabant Fund-15 with prescriptions, 2 with dental, and 1 with eyeglasses. We also assisted 20 families with electric bills, 17 with gas bills, 8 with water bills, 4 with rent, and 1 with a house payment. Of the total, 277 were previous clients and 2 were new ones.

In March and April, 2009, we gave food to 374 families with a total of 1328 people. We helped 8 families from the Trabant fund-2 with prescriptions, 2 dental, and 4 with glasses. We assisted 21 families with electric bills, 20 with gas bills, 17 with water bills, and 3 with rent. Of this total, 401 were previous clients and 17 were new.

On April 9, we gave away 65 Easter baskets filled with plastic eggs, caryons, McDonald's toys, small stuffed animals, four Cadbury candy eggs, and candy to the children. Some mothers also took Avon Bubble bath decanters. We also gave away Easter decorations and large stuffed Easter bunnies.

P.S.

The 2009-2010 school year will begin on August 7 in North Knox. Social Ministries can use the following to distribute to students who need help getting new school supplies: notebook paper, folders, pencils, ball point pens, crayons, scissors, glue, glue sticks, rulers, colored pencils, colored markers, school bags, pencil boxes, etc. Also, new socks and underwear for children. Please have donations turned in by August 2.

The cost is \$195 per person for 2 nights' lodging and meals for Friday evening, 3 meals Saturday and Sunday morning breakfast. Registration is required before July 1. We also want to thank the Sunday school for their donation to the Fellowship of Christian Farmers. It will be spent on supplies to build fences in Texas to replace fences destroyed during Hurricane Ike last year. The farmers are having to board out their cattle until fences can be restored and the cattle brought home. A number of groups from Indiana have gone to help. FCFI teams have built 200 miles of fence and 1500 miles remain to be built. Groups are still going there to help. Housing and some food is provided for participating groups. Church Council Meeting

May 11, 2009

Pastor's report-During the last month, Pastor Mike held one premarital counseling session, started conducting weekly staff meetings, attended a preschool meeting, mission committee meeting, National Day of Prayer gathering, preschool graduation, and a welcoming reception for "Russell", whom John Manning helped bring to the US from Iraq. He conducted a funeral service and has begun putting together a Bible study on 1 Timothy. He also made several home visits and assisted others who stopped by or called wanting counseling.

Secretary's report-Approved and accepted. A congregational meeting was held after worship service on Sunday, May 3 to discuss purchasing a new outside sign. A vote was taken and the motion to purchase a new sign was approved. In addition, plans to build a chapel were discussed, a vote was taken and the chapel plans were approved as well.

Treasurer's report-approved and accepted. The Cemetery Trust Status is at \$197,810. The youth group collected \$895 on Youth Sunday. Mission payments were discussed and disbursed-NKSM-\$700, Knox County Habitat for Humanity-\$1,000, and \$100 each to Bethel's three youth groups.

Deacon's report-approved and accepted.

Building and Grounds-Thanks were given to Bill Resler for spraying weeds in the parking lot. Five new listening devices will be purchased for the church. Shingles will be replaced on the roof soon. Lights will be replaced in the Hospitality Room.

Old Business:

Chapel-Three estimates will be taken for the Chapel. Bids will be given to Special Gifts committee for their approval.

Mabes estate status-Herman Tilly will attend a May 14 meeting for update.

Youth Pastor -Help wanted ads were placed in area newspapers to advertise for the youth pastor job opening.

Stools for funerals-Four counter stools will be purchased for families to use during funeral visitations. Some new purple altar cloths will be purchased, as well.

New Business:

Chairs-Linda Kixmiller, speaking on behalf of the Christian Partners Sunday school class, asked the council if the church could replace the chairs in the Sunday school class as the chairs that are currently in use are uncomfortable and hard for some older members to use. The chairs were replaced with chairs w/ arms from the church office and social room.

VBS-Vacation Bible School is scheduled for June 1-5. Volunteers are still needed. JoAnne Brocksmith will have a table set up after worship service for those who wish to make donations.

Work day date-Tabled until further notice.

The next council meeting will be Monday, June 8.
