We had a couple of visitors at preschool last month. Mrs. Cindy Jones of Knox County's Solid Waste Dept. came

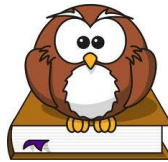

April 10, 2012

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mike shared his monthly report, which included sermon preparation, conducting a service at the Freelandville Community Home, preparing the confirmands for Confirmation on Palm Sunday, conducting the Confirmation Reunion service, facilitating the Financial Peace University class, conducting a funeral, visiting church members and others in the community, and holding counseling sessions.

Youth Pastor's Report: Pastor Shayne was not able to attend the meeting, but it was shared that the youth are very busy with their activities and continue to be available for work day projects. Youth Sunday will be on April 29th.

Secretary's Report: It was approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: It was approved as written.

Deacon's Report: The average attendance for March Sunday services was 138 and the month's offering was \$13,766.01. March income included: \$445.34, Atlas Gas; \$3,998.18, Bethel Preschool; \$110.88, interest from the Brocks Smith Mission Fund; \$50, Youth Fund; \$458.63, Youth Pastor/Mabes Fund; and, \$423.35, Memorial Fund. Mission allocations were: \$1,000, Nurses Fund; \$800, Life After Meth Fund; \$700, VU Campus Ministeries; and, \$1,000, Lighthouse Mission Fund. The written report was approved as writer.

Elder's Report: Visitations by the pastor and elders will resume in April.

Buildings and Grounds: It was reported that the flat roof leakage has been repaired by Wolfe Construction. Upon approval from North Knox Social Ministeries, workable window air conditioners no longer in use will be donated to them; Rowe Sargent will take care of moving them to the NKSM facility. Since some of the floor grates have been damaged, Anthis Heating is going to provide estimates for a more heavy style to use as replacements.

Old Business: Insurance bids have been received and will be analyzed by the deacons. They will report their recommendations at the next council meeting. Presentations by several financial institutions concerning the church's investments will be scheduled at a time when all council members are available. Dale Tiek has agreed to make an altar table for the chapel, and Gayle Perkins will be making reversible runners for it.

New Business: It was moved and seconded to accept the bid of Steve Page to paint the church guttering for \$1,246.92 and the lounge room for \$392. Due to soiling, having the cover on the kneeler replaced will be explored.
